EduNet Webinar: Colposcopic Photodocumentation of the Female Genitalia

Course Description: Accurate genital photographs are an essential part of the evaluation of children who may have been sexually abused. This webinar will provide an overview of colposcopic photodocumentation techniques to help you obtain high quality photographs, including use of correct aperture, focusing the colposcope and correct positioning as well as a review of the different types of colposcopes.

Learning Objectives:

1. The participant will be able to explain what elements are essential for effective colposcopic photodocumentation.
2. Participant will be able to state why effective photodocumentation is important for documenting child abuse evaluations.
